Dear parents, carers and students,

Schools are very busy places. I urge you all to read the newsletter every fortnight to ensure you are up to date on what is happening at Chester Hill P.S.

Classes 2020

The beginning of every year is always the same. It takes several days for all our families to return or to notify us that they have left the school. However, I am confident that those who are going to return have, so all students have been placed in their 2020 classes. Due to a very high number of new students, we have formed 28 classes. You will find a list of 2020 classes and their teacher along with a 2020 school map with this newsletter.

All classes are formed with the sole intention of placing your child in their best possible learning environment. When forming classes, the teachers and the executive take many factors into account such as academic achievement, social skills, work habits and previous class placements. Though friendships are important, in many instances, they may hinder learning and so they are not a high priority in class formation. Once classes are formed, there will be no movement among classes unless we form a new class. If your child is unhappy about their placement, it is not a reason to want to change class. Again, I would hope I have the support of all parents in recognising that the teachers, as educational experts, are the best people to form classes.

Meet the Teacher Afternoon

I have written and spoken many times about the importance of a strong home-school relationship in improving student learning outcomes. The initial step to achieving this outcome is by attending the meet the teacher afternoon on Wednesday 26 February. Please keep this date free in your diary. The meeting is held in your child's classroom and led by their class teacher. The teacher will discuss matters relating to: learning expectations, homework, excursions, class behaviour, homeclass communication procedures as well as whole school expectations and information.

This is not a meeting to discuss individual students. Those meetings (parent / teacher interviews) are held at the end of Term 1.

By your attendance at the Meet the Teacher afternoon it demonstrates to your children how importantly you value their education. I understand that many families may have students spread across several grades at the same time. I suggest that you split your time between the meetings. I would also ask that if possible children are not brought to the meetings. More information will follow.

Anaphylaxis – Students At Risk

Many of you would have heard of the word Anaphylaxis. If a person is anaphylactic they suffer from a very adverse allergic reaction to one or more things, the most common being nuts. In many cases this reaction may result in death.

We have several students at school who suffer from anaphylaxis. To help support and protect them while they are at school all staff must complete special training each year. To support these very vulnerable students I ask that if at all possible you do not send food to school which is made from nuts or may contain traces of nuts. Many foods that you think are nut free are not so please check the labels. To help support the safety of all students parents are reminded that our school with the support of our P&C has a policy of no birthday cakes (or birthday food) being brought to school to share with other students. As Principal it is my duty of care to ensure a safe learning environment for all students. In this case, I and the school cannot do it without the community's support of the school in this matter.

School Parking

The start and end of a school day is always a busy time with the traffic around any school very congested. For the safety of all students I urge all parents to obey the road rules and parking restrictions around the school during these busy times. The school has a small "Kiss and Drop" zone and any car can only have a maximum stay of a few minutes. No driver is allowed to leave their car. All parking around the school is classed as street parking unless otherwise signposted. I also advise all parents that council rangers patrol regularly and fines are issued to illegally parked cars.

A reminder that both staff parking areas are for staff only.

Our Canteen Name

During our canteen renovations in 2019 we decided to celebrate the history of our local area and recognise the traditional owners and custodians of the land by naming our new canteen after a word from the Darug language. We asked the students and staff to vote on a name that celebrated the spirit of our school and what we stood for as a community.

The name "Banda" was chosen which translates to Bush Apple Tree. The Darug people use the berries from the bush apple tree for food, to make medicines and to tell their stories through drawing. It is a resourceful plant which holds an important place in the community.

The bush apple is also resilient and incredibly tolerant, flourishing after times of adversity. Images of the bush apple tree will soon be seen around our canteen - on our menus, electronic screen, and hanging on the canteen walls. We look forward to incorporating more of the Darug culture in our canteen and its surrounds this year, as we continue to work on our community projects in 2020.
